

Montrose Airfield Fly In August 21st, 22nd and 23rd 2026

A Royal Flying Corps airfield was established at Montrose in 1913. In recognition of the important part it played in early military aviation, a small section of Montrose Airfield will again be open for light aircraft From Friday to Sunday August 21st to August 23rd 2026.

PPR is not essential but remember that the field is only suitable for aircraft with performance capability for a 500 metre grass strip.

The area available is the football pitches on the south west of the old airfield enclosed by the perimeter track. The landing strip will be marked by white markers and at the corners. It lies between the posts of three adjacent football pitches and thus the TORA and LDA available is some 515 metres with some 30 metres width.

Use of this pop up airfield is solely at pilot's own risk.

The surface has a sandy base, draining well and will have had the grass cut but there remain some undulations. A wind sock will be displayed. Aircraft parking will be to the south end of the playing fields. Please use SafetyCom 135.480 to aid awareness by other pilots. Circuits should be away from the town and therefore LH on 24 and RH on 06. Be aware that there is a lighting tower for the Football Ground close to the 06 approach. In addition be aware of car parking near the threshold of 24.



Pilots are welcome to camp by their aircraft and toilet facilities will be made available in the playing field changing block. The Museum will be open with fresh displays and a range of stalls, catering and fresh coffee. Don't forget to visit Major Burke's Shed at Hangar 18 with a Hunter, Jaguar and Tornado on display and the Bellman with a Sea King.
